Through volunteers and staff, PLC provides free civil legal services, including counseling, individual representation, community education, and strategic litigation and advocacy to challenge societal injustices. Now in its 35th year of service, PLC works with more than 1,400 volunteer lawyers, paralegals and law students from throughout the county who volunteer their time and expertise. In the past few years, PLC has made significant strides in a wide array of policy advocacy and impact litigation matters including projects in the areas of housing, health, immigration and consumer law.</p>
