Position	Part-time Removal Defense Project Coordinator –Immigration Unit
Organization Description	The Public Law Center (PLC)'s Immigration Unit is seeking an energetic, passionate advocate to join our team in fighting for justice for Orange County's immigrant communities through innovative, collaborative, community-centered lawyering.
	PLC's Immigration Unit provides fearless direct legal representation to, in addition to coordinating and supervising pro bono representation for, survivors of domestic violence, human trafficking, and other crimes (U Visas, T Visas, and VAWA petitions); children who have been abused, abandoned, or neglected (Special Immigrant Juvenile petitions); young people who arrived as children (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals); legal permanent residents seeking U.S. Citizenship (naturalization); and for immigrants in Immigration Court proceedings (both detained and non-detained removal defense).
Qualifications	 Bachelors degree or equivalent required. Bilingual English/Spanish or English/Vietnamese helpful, but not required Strong organizational skills, including ability to manage multiple tasks, work independently, and as part of a team. Demonstrated commitment to working with immigrant communities Computer literacy in Microsoft Word and Excel, and the ability to learn other software programs. Strong oral/written communications skills and the ability to communicate with a variety of audiences, including clients, community partners, and volunteer attorneys. Must have own transportation, valid CA Drivers license, insurance and good driving record; travel throughout Orange and neighboring counties will be necessary
Duties and Responsibilities	 Coordinate the provision of immigration legal services to low-income clients in immigration detention and in non-detained removal proceedings. Develop and promote policies and procedures to encourage collaboration among regional legal service providers in the area of removal defense. Recruit, coordinate and supervise non-attorney volunteers through training, technical support, and general supervision. Assist with intake of potential clients as needed. Oversee grant management, including collection of data, reporting, and collaboration with community partners. Represent PLC at collaborative and community outreach events and meetings. Part-time position (20 hrs/week), with occasional evening/weekend work required
